



Bilateral Agreement



Between

the European Public Law Organization (EPLO), an International Organization with its headquarters established in Greece,

and

the Belarusian State University

Whereas

Both parties acknowledge that University education in the present even more globalized era must correspond to offering students qualifications and knowledge that are both recognized and applicable beyond the strict confines of single-state markets, which also reflect and correspond to the new opportunities and challenges brought by the opening up of markets and the breakdown of barriers to the free movement of professionals, goods and services,

Both parties acknowledge that especially in the fields of legal and governance studies the demands on young practitioners have to be met by new and targeted University programs and training courses,

The Board of Directors of the EPLO has decided on the 10th of September 2009 the creation of a higher education agency called the European Law and Governance School (ELGS),

The Executive Committee of the EPLO adopted the Regulation of the higher education agency on 23.07.2010, in which the provisional syllabus and programmes of studies are annexed,

Hereby agree on the **mutual recognition of their respective undergraduate and postgraduate degrees**, in accordance with the laws of the parties, taught and research based, under the following terms and conditions:

1. Teaching Staff Mobility

- a. The EPLO and the Belarusian State University establish a teaching staff mobility scheme.
- b. Each party shall determine annually the minimum and maximum number of visiting posts offered to the teaching staff of the other party, on the basis of availability of posts and academic needs. Such

determination will also entail the duration of visiting posts offered, and the specific qualifications that visiting academics should have.

- c. Remuneration of teaching staff enrolled in the mobility scheme shall be borne by the host institution for the visiting period, and shall correspond to the rules applicable to permanent academics of the host institution. Medical Insurance may be offered by the institution of origin to visiting academics upon request.
- d. The EPLO and the Belarusian State University establish a academic staff mobility scheme. Each Party shall bear the costs (frees) for accommodation.

2. Student Mobility

- a. The EPLO and the Belarusian State University establish a student mobility scheme.
- b. Each party shall determine annually the maximum number of seats offered to the students of the other party, on the basis of availability of seats and academic and educational needs. Such determination will also entail the duration of student mobility offered, and the specific qualifications that visiting students should have.
- c. During the mobility period, students shall comply with the rules and regulations of the host institution.
- d. The host institution shall assist visiting students in finding appropriate accommodation.
- e. Student fees during the mobility period shall be paid to the institution of origin, and shall correspond to the respective rules of the sending institution applicable to their students.

3. Institutional Cooperation

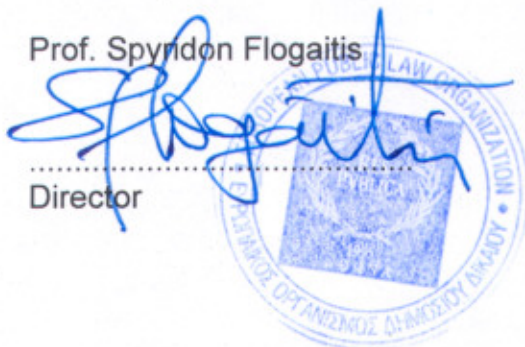
- a. The Belarusian State University shall appoint a representative to the Council of Representatives of the EPLO higher education agency, as well as an alternate member.
- b. The representative of the Belarusian State University shall take part in the ordinary and extraordinary meetings of the Council of Representatives. Costs and expenses for the participation of the representative of the University at the meetings of the Council of Representatives shall be borne by the represented University.
